Are We Prepared for Emergencies?

The meeting began with a warm welcome by President Saroj Jhawar. Rtn.Arjan Singh gave in brief, the details of micro loan projects and informed that Miss Khushboo, a MBA student of Chandigarh College of Engineering, studying in IInd semester & a meritorious student all along has been selected for assistance of Rs.47,000/- which is equivalent to USD 1000. The cheque for Rs.47,000/- was presented by President Saroj to Miss Khushboo.

IPDG Shaju Peter then introduced the guest speaker Dr. Rita Kalra, from General Hospital, Panchkula, to the House. Dr. Rita Kalra graduated from Bhilai, has inclination for social service and has served in many camps organized by various NGOs. She has

specialized in Dental Surgery. She focussed her talk on 'Are we prepared for Emergencies?'

Dr. Rita Kalra presented her talk with graphics and told that emergency was the situation which was acute and requires immediate treatment. She further informed that there are emergencies with respect to medical emergencies, pediatric treatment, surgical treatment, orthopaedic and dental emergency. She explained in detail how one can attend primary emergency using air way, breathing, circumflexion and further advised home treatments using ample water & salt. She stressed for first aid measures in case of dog-bite, snake-bite, etc. In case

of dog-bite, the wound should be washed with ample water and then patient is to be brought to the hospital for vaccination. Similarly in case of snakebite, one should wash the wound, put salt and then vaccination to be taken at near by hospital.

Under ORTHOPAEDIC SURGERIES, there are symptoms of sprain, low back pain, joint pain, fracture, dislocation, etc. For these emergencies, she advised to mobilize support and bring the patients to hospital.

For surgical emergencies like burns, acute abdomen pain, accidental injuries and urine retention, she gave tips in case of emergency. Use of lot of water was more important.

Dental Emergencies viz. toothache, bleeding gums, lock jaw, tongue cheek bite and tooth fracture was dealt in detail and members were given tips in case of emergency.


