"Look Beyond the Parish Pump !"



Many of you must have observed wondrously a fruit-bearing tree in full bloom. Though its trunk remains erect, the branches bough down. A man of science explains it through gravitational laws. An artist longingly looks at its beauty and translates it into an art form. The philosopher however, explains this as natural humility.

That is the aura that our Honored Guest, Rotary International President Elect John Kenny exuded.

And why not? As a man of deep spirituality, a Presbyterian Elder, he is considered 'just, fair, temperate, sober, patient, prudent, an able teacher, respectable, and above all, a blameless steward of God', just as described in the Bible. That is how an elder is regarded in Christianity. After all, Elders are specially commissioned non-clergy who take part in pastoral care and decision making at all levels - a great responsibility.

He has in him, as PRIP Raja described, a streak of child-like innocence.

Add all this together, and you have a sagaciously innocent man with practical wisdom. No wonder, he has enunciated a practical theme for his year of presidency.

To welcome and meet such a personality, a special Intercity was organized and hosted by our Club on Saturday, April, 11, with IPDG Shaju Peter as the Visit Coordinator and PP Ajit Gulati as

the Event Chair.

Speaking crisply on the occasion, following a detailed introduction by PRIP Rajendra Saboo, John Kenny spoke of his village childhood, and his magical exposure to the world 'beyond the parish pump' through letters and discussion with his father and uncle. This, he said, was the beginning of his life's eventful journey. Rotary opened tremendous possibilities of acts of goodness with confidence, sincerity and passion. This chain continues over the years. He shared issues that need to be nailed immediately - Water, for example, is critical. Its shortage could create wars. Heath, and Hunger, were priorities on his list. Increasing literacy, particularly among the girl-child is an important priority. Rotary, he said, was working single-mindedly towards eradicating Polio. It was challenging to raise funds to meet the world's needs. All these, he said, will give the world a brighter and better tomorrow, and a stronger future. "The important thing in a million-mile journey", he said, "was not the journey itself, but the first step". DGE Chetan Aggarwal proposed the formal vote of thanks.

Membership Leaders Discuss Economic Crisis

Regional Rotary International Membership Coordinators (RRIMCs) discussed how to respond to the worldwide economic crisis when they met in Chicago for an annual training event.

The RRIMCs, who work with Districts and Clubs to improve member recruitment and retention, also focussed on ways to achieve diversity and increase retention rates.

Judi Beard-Strubing, an RRIMC from Zone 23 in the USA and a retired Wall Street financial adviser, noted that some Rotarians are resigning from their clubs as a result of job loss or economic difficulties.

During a discussion led by Beard-Strubing and John Gomes, a member of the RI Membership Development and Retention Committee and a former RRIMC from South Africa, participants suggested that Rotary Clubs help struggling members pay their dues by establishing support programs, or even dipping into district funds to offset some of the cost. Other ideas included:

- Allowing club members to attend meetings without having to pay for a full meal
- Finding a less expensive venue for club meetings
- Surveying club members about why they value Rotary, and contacting members who have stopped attending meetings to find out why
- Offering a job networking service to unemployed club members, such as through a club or District website

RRIMC James Ives from Michigan, USA, cautioned that steps should not be seen as lowering the value of Rotary.

Diversity

RI President-elect John Kenny has set a membership goal of a net increase of one new member per club and one new club per District during the 2009-10 Rotary year.

Kenny's membership goals also include encouraging more qualified women, young professionals, and Rotary Foundation and RI program alumni to become Rotarians so that each Rotary club reflects the demographics of the business community that surrounds it

Don Garner, a former Ambassadorial Scholar and past president of the Rotary Club of Chicago, USA, said that people just starting their careers need the networking opportunities Rotary offers. His club welcomed 64 new members, including many program alumni, during his year as president. "I did not anticipate becoming a Rotarian," he said, "but I can attest to the willingness of many Rotary alumni to join Rotary."

Retention

Kenny has also asked for an 80 percent member retention rate in 2009-10.

During a breakout discussion, one group of RRIMCs agreed that new club members need to be invited to serve on committees or service projects to feel welcome and included. Some suggested that it may be best in some cases to guide potential members to form a new club. The original club can sponsor the new club, whose members are more likely to feel vested in Rotary.

The RRIMC program was started in 2001. RRIMCs, all Past District Governors, are appointed by the RI President-elect to a maximum term of three years. Terms are staggered among the RRIMCs and the group represents all Rotary zones.
