Witness to an Execution

Hailing originally from the North West Frontier Province, Dr Jagdip Singh Vasdev, our Guest Speaker last Friday, a family friend of the Anand's, did his medicine from Amritsar, responded early to the call given by the charismatic Jawahar Lal Nehru and served in Punjab's Rural Health Service, and then to build on his expertise did his MS in Surgery from PGI, Chandigarh. After serving in Haryana as Civil Surgeon for 20 years, he was appointed Medical Superintendent, Rohtak Medical College, when he was promoted as Director, Health Services, Haryana. Upon his retirement, he joined Sri Ganga

Ram Hospital as Medical Superintendent, and later joined Fortis. He opted to do charitable work and is now associated with the UT Red Cross and several charitable projects. He was introduced by President Prem himself.

Bemoaning the fact that doctors who having taken the Hippocratic Oath to save lives as apostles of mercy and benevolence, had also to oversee the execution of a condemned prisoners under due process of law, under provisions of the Constitution, he said. And

although the experience may be traumatic, it needs to be carried out. The process has therefore two connotations – one legal, and the other medical.

Speaking of the legal connotation he said, that relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code deal in "culpable homicide" which is punishable by death. The act done by the person must be censurable. Causing death by murder can be censurable, but all death is not murder, and not censurable.

He had the opportunity to witness 'death by hanging' in early part of his career, at the Central Jail, Amritsar. It is team that executes this order of the court through what is called a "black warrant". The team consists of a minimum of four officers, a Magistrate 1st Class, a Police Officer not below the rank of a Deputy Superintendent of Police, the Jail Superintendent of the Jail where the execution takes place, and a doctor not below the rank of a Civil Surgeon. The execution must be carried out as per rules of the Jail Manual. The first of the processes to be adhered is the medical examination, including his or her

weight, because this determines the drop of the rope used for hanging. The rope used must be tested, and its length determined. Every minute detail, including the drop door opening, the sandbags, is calculated as per specifications. The prisoners wish and will if any is also recorded. The family needs to be informed. All barracks are sealed so as not to allow movement of inmates inside the jail premises. Upon hanging, the prisoner is left hanging for about half an hour



and then examined by the doctor who has to declare him dead. The entire process is witnessed with stoic silence before the dead body is handed over to the relatives.

Witnessing an execution, said Dr. Jagdip Singh Vasdev, has a sobering effect. It precipitates mixed feelings, including the debate on capital punishment, which said, was meant to act as a deterrent from heinous crimes.

Taking 'ASRAA" Forward

A shelter for attendants of patients at the Sector 32 Government College and Hospital was constructed during the Rotary Year 2008-09 under the stewardship of PP Saroj Jhawar.

Over the past year, it was observed that because of lack of basic amenities, the shelter christened "ASRAA" fell into disuse. This year, under the dynamic stewardship of President Prem Anand, the Board took a decision to rectify this situation. A new Committee was formed, and the nitty-gritty's of the failings analyzed.

Among the observations made was the lack of night security, for which gates have been proposed; the lack of sleeping facilities, for which 20-steel bedsteads with winter bedding has been proposed to be donated, along with secure stocking arrangement; both the intense heat and cold, in summers and winters, due to excessive side ventilators, as well as the unprotected fibre roofing, for which 'chiks' are proposed, and perhaps , several coats of heat-reflective paint is proposed, without affecting lighting conditions and save electricity; and finally a tuck-shop for refreshment and fooding, for which the Club is on the look-out for a suitable person.

Initially, security concerns shall be addressed, for which the gate is proposed Very generous Midtowners have already begun donating for this Project. They are
