



President R.T.P.S. Tulsi's first address at 'home ground'

Our club meeting on July 11, 2014 was the first meeting of the Rotary year 2014-15 in our regular venue, Hotel President, Chandigarh, after an impressive installation ceremony held last week at CII, Chandigarh. President Rtn. R.T.P.S. Tulsi welcomed a guest from Allahabad, PDG Rtn. Pradeep Mukherjee, a friend of PDG Shaju Peter. Later, during fellowship PDG Mukherjee and PP Rtn. Dr. V.J.S Vohra together

went down the memory lane to mid 1960s as both of them turned out to school mates of St. Josephs School, Allahabad. Shaju remarked, "This is Rotary, as it brings old acquaintances together after so many years!"

President Tulsi in his address quoted the guiding principles of Rotary. He said, "To become a worthy Rotarian, it is essential that at the beginning of a new year, we need to recall the Objects of Rotary, the Rotarian Code of Conduct and the Four-Way Test."

The **Object of Rotary** is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- **FIRST:** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- **SECOND:** High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

- **THIRD:** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- **FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

The Four-Way Test Of the things we think, say or do

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Rotary Code of Conduct: As a Rotarian, I will:

1. Act with integrity and high ethical standards in my personal and professional life
2. Deal fairly with others and treat them and their occupations with respect
3. Use my professional skills through Rotary to mentor young people, help those with special needs, and improve people's quality of life in my community and in the world
4. Avoid behavior that reflects adversely on Rotary or other Rotarians
5. Not seek special business or professional advantages from other Rotarians

The President not only read out the above guidelines in the meeting, but also distributed attractive bookmarks to remind us to 'Light up Rotary', the RI theme for 2014-15. One should regularly follow these very meaningful principles of life which we can access on the net, and for those who are not net savvy, these are prominently displayed in our Roster of Members.

We also acknowledge the esteemed presence of Chartered Accountant Mr.

Pushpinder Duggal and his colleagues, who were invited to represent the BJP point of view. It is regretted that they could not participate in the budget discussions due to unavoidable circumstances.

The middle class, of course, was well pleased with the small Income Tax reliefs given to them. Most of the critics are from the Opposition, doing their duty by complaining about every aspect of

the Finance Minister Arun Jaitley's presentation. In fact, the FM and his team performed a difficult balancing act between promoting growth and serving fiscal prudence, barely within 45 days of existence of the new government.

Though the Finance Minister tried to give relief to the individual taxpayers, he however stopped short of addressing the concerns regarding other sectors, which were eagerly expecting some relief. With the view to provide relief to small and marginal and the senior citizens, he increased the personal income tax exemption limit by Rs 50,000 from Rs 2 lakh to Rs 2.50 lakh in case of all individual tax payer who are below the age of 60 years. Exemption limit has been raised from Rs 2.5 lakh to Rs 3 lakh in the case of senior citizens. There is nothing special for women tax payers and there is no

change in the rate of surcharge either for the corporate or the individuals, HUFs, firms etc.

Investment limit under section 80C of the Income Tax Act has also

been raised from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 1.5 lakh which will encourage savings. In further relief to the depositors, the Finance Minister has raised Public Provident Fund (PPF) deposit limit from Rs. 1 lakh to Rs 1.5 lakh per annum.

The realty sector, which has been under pressure for past 2-3 years, is heading for some major gains as there are incentives for real estate investments. The Budget has made purchase of homes more attractive by raising deduction against interest payment on home loan from the taxable income to Rs 2,00,000 from Rs 1,50,000. This will enable the home buyers to reduce his or her tax liability. Increase in tax slabs by Rs. 50000 will further strengthen the common men's hope of owning a home, turning their dreams into reality.

Liberalisation of foreign direct investment (FDI) by raising it to 49 percent from 26 percent will provide the much needed certainty to foreign players and to a sector that has the promise to provide increased commerce and generate employment in the country.

The opening up of 4 additional AIIMS and 12 government medical

colleges is expected to ensure improvement in the quality of medical education and is a step towards covering the shortage of doctors in India. However, it is felt that instead of setting up more establishments, the infrastructure, facilities and working conditions within the existing ones should have been boosted up and upgraded as the present scenario is not so friendly.

To encourage small entrepreneurs, an investment allowance at the rate of 15 percent to a manufacturing company that invests more than Rs. 25 crore in any year in new plant and machinery has been announced. The benefit will be available for three years, that is, for investments upto 31.03.2017. Investment allowance to manufacturing company investing more than Rs.100 crore announced last year will continue till 31.03.2015.

Housewives have been economising on their kitchen expenses, owing to exorbitant prices of essential items, but the government's announcement on packaged/processed food products and edible oil is likely to give some respite to them.

Dates changed for 2015 São Paulo RI Convention

Rotary International President Rtn. Gary Huang and the RI Board have changed the dates for the 2015 Rotary Convention in São Paulo, Brazil, to Saturday, 6 June 2015, through Tuesday, 9 June 2015 – starting and ending one day earlier than previously scheduled. The dates were changed because the original opening day (Sunday, 7 June) coincided with one of the city's most popular parades.




