#### **Climate Change and India**



PP Prof. Dr. S.K. Sharma

In our regular meeting on February 05, 2016 PP Dr. Professor S.K. Sharma spoke on the topic 'Climate Change and India'. PP Harish Sethi, while introducing the speaker, recalled his four decade old association with Professor Sharma at Panjab University, when both were serving the university. Prof. S.K. Sharma is Professor Emeritus and former Dean University Instructions and Founder Director, Energy Research Centre Panjab

University and Chairman Chemical Engineering Department, Panjab University, Chandigarh, He has PhD degree in Chemical Engineering from Panjab University and D.A.E.T. - University of Florida, Gainesville, USA. He has been a visiting Professor at University of Florida, USA. Professor Sharma has 38 years of successful experience in academics, research, administration, technology development and transfer in the area of Energy and Environment. Professor Sharma has successfully transferred Green technologies developed by him to a number of countries in Asia and Pacific region under aegis of UNICEF, FAO, Commonwealth Secretariat and WHO. Prof. Sharma was a member of Prime Minister Manmohan Singh's advisory board. He has been awarded number of prestigious fellowship including Fulbright Fellowship and was invited by a number of prestigious universities in USA, UK and Canada. He is the past president of Indian Institute of Chemical Engineers, Member of Executive Committee of World Chemical Engineering Council and the fellow of Institution of Engineers India and a number of other prestigious professional societies. Keeping in view of his contributions in the area of science and technology, Professor Sharma has been conferred upon a number of prestigious awards such as Surya Award, B.P.Godrej Life Time Achievement Award, Prof. Dr. H.L. Roy Memorial Oration Award, Distinguished Alumnus Award of Panjab University Chandigarh, Deepak Group's Padma Bhushan Professor L.K. Doraiswamy CDS Award of Indian Institute of Chemical Engineers.

Speaking on the topic 'Climate Change and India', Prof. Sharma

said that the assembly of more than 160 heads of states from different countries of the world recently in France to finalize the climate deal shows the critical importance of this issue. If urgent measures are not taken, there will be catastrophic consequences for whole world due to climate change. Climate is defined as the longterm weather pattern in an area, which includes: type, timing and amount of rainfall and snow, humidity, sunshine hours, average wind speeds and directions, number of days above freezing, frequency of weather extremes, and local geography. Climate change, depicts the change in the these parameters, as a result of influence of many interacting factors both natural and manmade. natural factors include changes in Earth's orbit and the amount of energy coming from the sun. Ocean changes and volcanic eruptions are also natural causes of climate change. However, scientists think that recent warming can't be explained by nature factors alone and it's very likely that most of the warming since the mid-1900s is due to the burning of coal, oil and gas to produce most of the energy that we use every day. This burning adds heat-trapping gases, such as carbon dioxide, Methane etc. into the air. These gases are called greenhouse gases. The impact of these gases on climate is termed as global warming.

It has been observed that global atmospheric concentrations of carbon dioxide, methane, and nitrous oxide have increased substantially since pre-industrial period. It has been seen that eleven of the last twelve years rank among the 12 warmest years. As a result of climate change, the projected sea level rise by the end of this century is likely to be 0.18 to 0.59 metres. It is also projected by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) that the global temperatures will rise by 2-4.5°C by 2050. These, climateinduced changes in 2050 will result in the decrease in food grain yields in developing countries. In India, there will be a decrease in output ranging from 19% for irrigated rice and 34% for irrigated wheat and 27% for maize. There will be a loss of 1.5 million tons of milk by 2020. As a result, India will face serious food shortages as well as drastic fall in the agriculture income and employment, In addition, 175 million children will be affected every year due to diarrhoea, malaria and pneumonia. A one meter sea level rise could lead to displacement of 7 million persons within India and half a million hectares of land will get submerge, breeding and migration of fish will be adversely affected .Land loss due to submergence as well as due to salination will also take place.

Dr. Sharma also explained that developed countries are contemplating putting a border carbon tax based on life cycle assessment, on the import of material from developing countries on

the pattern shipping and civil aviation tax. This will have a severe impact on the exports from India. Thus, there is an urgent need for the industry to decarbonise its processes, inputs, supply chain and products.

Dr. Sharma suggested that Rotarians should reduce the carbon footprints in their households, commercial business, and travel, so as to fight the climate change, by under taking energy conservation measures and use of renewable sources of energy. PP Prof. Sharma also suggested that Rotary International should fix a carbon reduction target of few million tons of carbon reduction for its members, so as promote sustainable development and fighting global warming. Carbon reduction projects in Rotary clubs could become a signature project of Rotary International after Polio eradication.

After the lecture there was an interactive session which generated a lot interest amongst the Rotarians and Anns. It was suggested that there should another talk on the subject by PP Prof. Sharma. President Kanan Diwan agreed to hold another lecture on the topic and PP. Prof. Sharma agreed for the same.
