## INITIATIVES IN UT CHANDIGARH

Mr. Vivek Atray HCS, the speaker for our Club Meeting on July 13, 2007, had his schooling in Jaipur, London, New Delhi and St John High School Chandigarh. Got his degree in Electronics and Communications from Regional Engineering College (now National Institute of

Technology) Kurukshetra in 1988. As Director IT UT Chandigarh from 2000 to 2006, he earned laurels locally and nationally to bring Chandigarh on the IT map of the country. He was bestowed with he e-Governance Champion Award by Data Quest North Zone. His contribution has en Chandigarh the status of the best e-Governance state in the country by the Government of India and the Computer Society of India. Mr. Vivek Attray, at present, is the Director Public Relations, UT Chandigarh.

Rtn RS Sachdeva introduced Mr. Vivek Attray. He described Chandigarh as

the happening place and Mr. Attray as the architect of IT climate and other initiatives in Chandigarh.

Mr. Attray introduced the subject by giving the example of the consumer goods manufacturing and marketing companies in India, who test their products in Chandigarh because the people of Chandigarh have


exposure, are aware, demanding and responsive to ideas and are assertive.

The learned Speaker explained that the idea of a Smoke Free Chandigarh has been around the think tanks of Chandigarh. Smokers and non-Smokers, both have their

rights and these rights must be honored. Smokers should have a place to smoke and the non-Smokers must not be exposed to passive smoking. A solution to these two requirements has to be worked out and implemented. The move to make Chandigarh a smoke-free City may or may not succeed but Chandigarh will show the way to the rest of the Country. There are laws to prohibit smoking in public places but these laws and rules have to be elaborated and implemented.

Traffic is another issue in Chandigarh that has the highest number of

automotives per capita and this number is increasing day by day at an alarming rate. At the same time, the road length in the City remains constant. The roads and parking spaces are crowded and accidents are frequent. Ways must be found to reduce the congestion on the roads by improving the public transport system, by



making it costlier to drive in and near the City Center, and encourage car-pooling. Another way to reduce the congestion on the roads is to make the City cycle and pedestrian friendly, as the distances from the residential areas to the nearby markets are small. 

people would find a way and show the path to the other cities in the country. He emphasized that Rotary can play a big role in solving the congestion by creating awareness and setting personal examples.

The population increase of Chandigarh is more in the form of labour and unskilled persons than the influx of professionals. This has affected the standard of cleanliness in the City and has brought in the practice of encroachments on public land. We have to work out humane and workable methods to stop or reduce this downgrading of the city standards and the aspirations of the professional and the migrant labour. On these issues again, Rotary can help in creating awareness on keeping the City clean and green. The learned Speaker was happy that the green cover of the city has shown a steady increase (Rotary has significant contribution in the increase in the green cover).

Mr. Attray advocated public participation in finding solutions and hoped that concerted efforts on the part of

Mr. Attray stated that the Administration is aware of this issue and the traffic police have been asked to look into this.


UT Police. He cited an incidence on the night 4/5 March 2007, when thieves entered their house. They called the Police who were there in minutes. Anne Nirmal Nagra explained another such good response when, during the admission rush in July 2007, she was passing by the MCM DAV College and got badly stuck in the traffic jam, she called the Police and they were there even sooner than minutes and controlled the situation. She added that such good response by the UT Police should be appreciated and brought to the notice of the public.

Rtn Ashish Ahuja brought out the poor state of roads in the industrial areas of the City. PP Rtn Pallav Mukherjee, a Councilor of the City, introduced the other councilors present in the meeting i.e. Dr AP Sanwaria, Mr. Jetinder Bhatia and Mr. Kalha.
